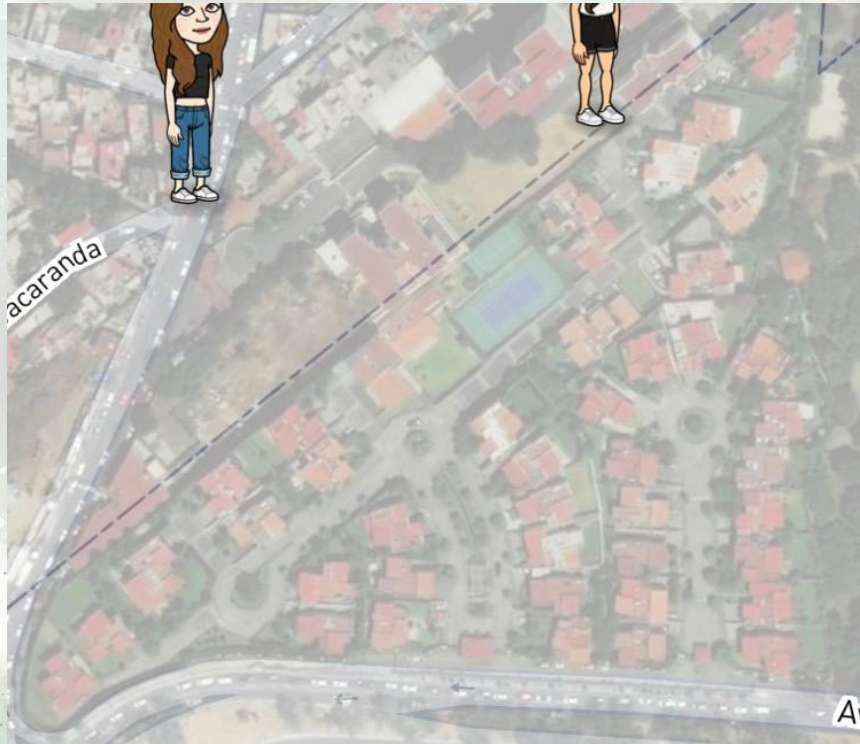

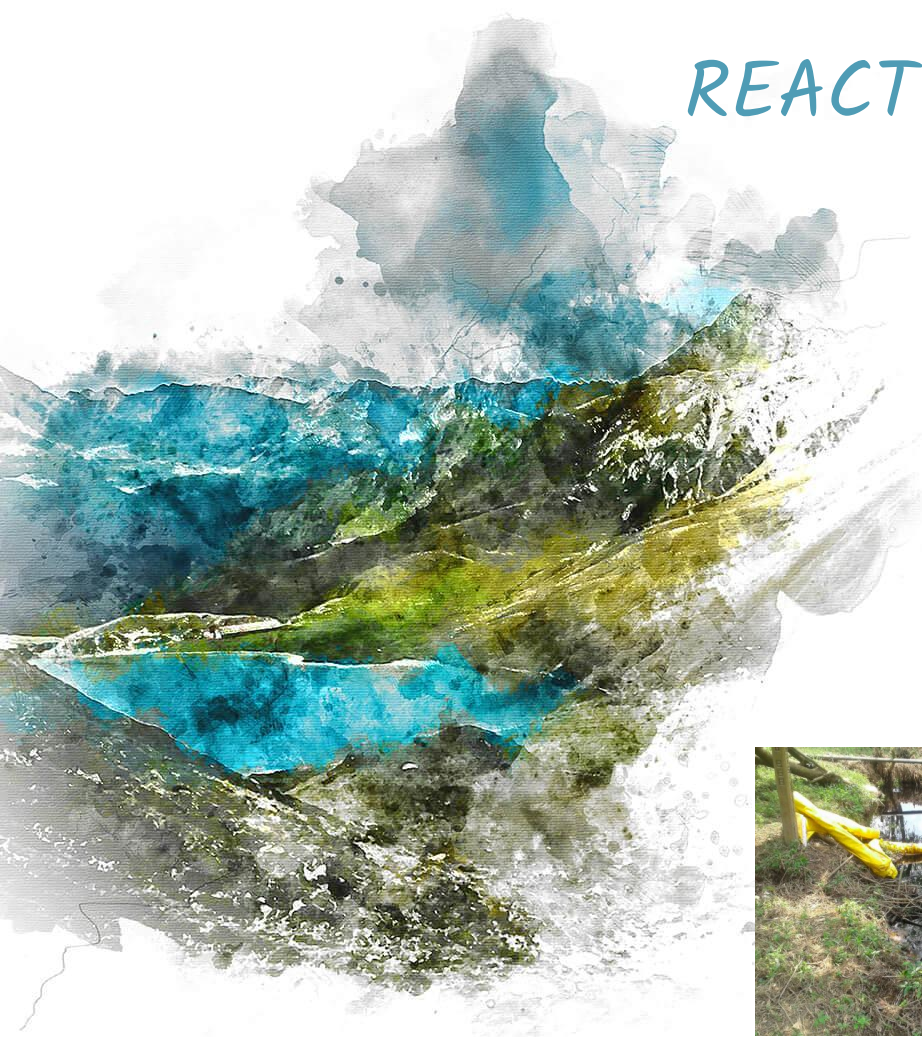

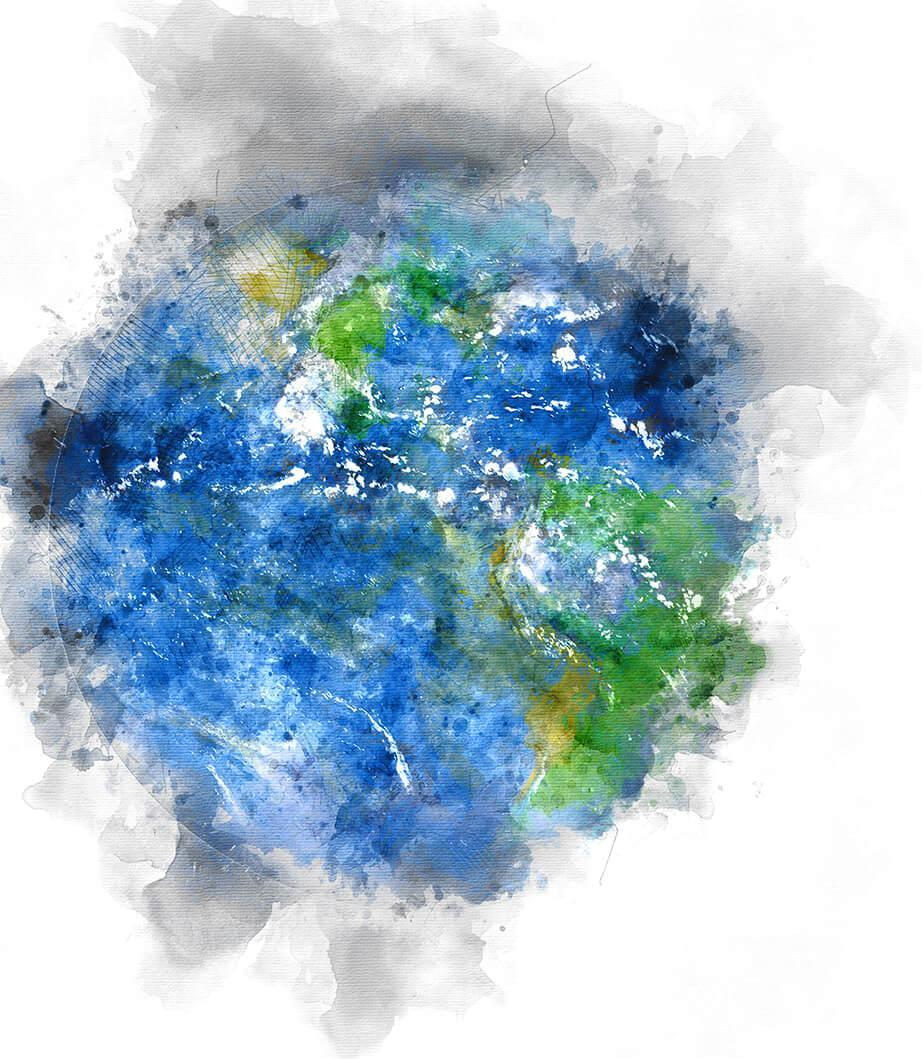


In Mexico, oil spills have caused serious environmental and health damage to the population, so environmentalists demand the application of an emergency plan, since the recovery of affected areas takes years.
